- 4 years College Prep English
- 2 years of Social Science:
 - World History
 - U.S. History
 - American Gov.
- 3 years of Math/ 4 years recommended



CSU/UC requirements cont. . .

- 2 years of Science (3 years recommended for UC)
-1 year Life Science/ 1 year Physical Science
- 2 years World Language (3 years recommended for UC)
- 1 year college prep Fine Art
- Must take SAT Reasoning or ACT
- 3.0 minimum GPA (CSU)
- 3.0 minimum GPA (UC)

How Can I Prepare for the SAT or ACT?

- Start taking the PSAT in the 8th grade.
- Practice on the Khan Academy
- Visit the ACT Academy website to practice for the ACT

- Peer Counseling, Leadership, and Yearbook (Applications were **due Feb 1st**)
- AVID (Applications are due February 15th)
