PSAT 8 AND PSAT/NMSQT TESTS

The Clovis North Educational Center counseling staff recommends that your son/daughter take the practice tests for the SAT described below. These tests provide an excellent opportunity to participate in National testing programs and can be an effective diagnostic tool. There are no passing scores for these tests.

You may sign up and pay for the PSAT test online through RevTrak starting July 29, 2021. If you are unable to register and pay online; PSAT registration forms will be available in the Counseling Center starting August 16th, 2021. The last day to sign up for the PSAT is Friday, August 27, 2021 by 4:00 pm.

- Pending CDC guidelines- students may be required to wear mask for the duration of the exam. Any students determined ill or have a high temperature will not be allowed to test and be sent home.

Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate is in the process of electing members to the School Site Council (SSC) for the 2021-2022. The SSC is required for schools receiving categorical funds such as Title I and Title III funds. These funds are used to supplement the regular school program Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate School receives the following categorical funds: *Title III*.

The purpose of the of the SSC is to ensure the school is continually engaged in identifying and implementing curriculum and instructional practices resulting in strengthening the core academic program and ensuring pupils have access and success in school. This core program should embody the District's curriculum, which itself should reflect the state frameworks and curriculum standards. The SSC is charged with the task to develop and approve the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA); which is a comprehensive plan designed to improve the effectiveness of the school program The school's improvement effort should also be coordinated with the District's effort to upgrade its curriculum offerings and quality of instruction in order that both the school, through the SSC, and the Governing Board, through the District Office, become part of a single improvement effort. The council shall carry out all other duties and responsibilities assigned to it in the Education Code of the State of California.

Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate in Clovis Unified School District (CUSD) has designated our School Site Council (SSC) established pursuant to California Education Code (EC) Section 52852 to function as the School Advisory Committee (SAC). One member of the SAC designates one member from the school SSC to serve as a voting member on the District Advisory Committee (DAC). SAC serves an advisory committee for the purpose of advising schools regarding their specific categorical programs and the role of developing the LCAP in the creation of a plan that will make a meaningful difference in the lives of our students. The District Advisory Committee (DAC) will engage in meaningful consultation, under the guidelines provided by Administrative Procedure 9062, on any program changes that have not originated from the DAC.

In order to accomplish this task, the SSC meets on a regular basis to assess student needs, develop and approve the plan including categorical budgets, and monitor its implementation. At Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate School the SSC meets on a quarterly basis in Room 245.

Members of the SSC include the principal, classroom teachers, other staff members, parents, and at the secondary level, students. Members of the SSC are elected by their peers; therefore, parents are elected by parents. Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate Parents need to be elected this year for the 2021-2022 SSC. A member serves for two years. If you are interested in being a member of the SSC, please fill out the nomination form below and return it to school with your child no later than September 3, 2021. After all nominations are in, a digital ballot will be sent out to all parents. The parents with the highest number of votes will serve on the SSC.

Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC)

Dear Parents,

Clovis North High School/Granite Ridge Intermediate is in the process of forming the English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC) for the 2021-22 school year. The ELAC is required for schools with an enrollment of 21 or more English Learners (EL). At Clovis North High School, the ELAC will meet four times a year during the lunch period.

The purpose of the ELAC is to advise the principal, and staff on:

- The development of a detailed school plan for English Learners submitted to the Governing Board.
- The development of the school's needs assessment.
- Administrators of the school's language census.
- Efforts to make parents aware of the importance of regular school attendance.

Parents on the ELAC are elected by their peers; therefore, parents elect parents. School sites with 21-50 EL students should have an ELAC membership of at least eight (8) people. Four of the eight must be parents; of which two must be parents of EL students. School sites with 51 or more EL students should have an ELAC membership of at least ten (10) people. Five of the ten must be parents; of which four must be parents of EL students. All parents shall be the parents /guardians of the English learners at the school site. The first step is to determine the number of parents/guardians of English learners that need to be on the committee. Other parents/guardians of students at the school may serve on this committee as long as they were elected by the parent/guardians of English learners. The other members may be teachers, resource teachers, bilingual instructional assistants, principals, and other parents this may include a parent/guardian of a reclassified EL Student. Parents/ guardians of EL students, not employed by the District, shall constitute the majority of the committee membership (51% or more).

Clovis North High School has an EL enrollment of 34 and requires an ELAC membership of 8, of which 2 must be parents of EL students. Granite Ridge Intermediate has an EL enrollment of 30 and requires an ELAC membership of 8, of which 2 must be parents of EL students. AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION AT SCHOOL

California Education Code 49423 defines certain requirements for administration of medication "...any pupil who is required to take, during the regular school day, medication prescribed for him/her by a physician, may be assisted by the school nurse of other designated school personnel if the school district receives (1) a written statement from such physician detailing the method, amount, and time schedules by which medication is to be taken, and (2) a written statement from the parent or guardian of the pupil indicating the desire that the school district assist the pupil in the matter set forth in the physician statement." CUSD Board Policy No. 2401 does not allow students to administer their own medication without written permission as stated above.

Additionally, CUSD Administrative Regulation No. 2401 indicates that school personnel are <u>prohibited</u> from administering any over-the-counter or prescription medications including, aspirins, vitamins, antihistamines, etc. unless the medication is accompanied with <u>written permission from both the parent/guardian and physician</u>. The medication must be clearly labeled and sent to school in a container from the pharmacy and <u>will be kept in the school office unless otherwise directed by the physician</u>.

All medication orders will be automatically discontinued at the end of the school year after summer school.

New orders are required each school year.

Parent Request For Assistance with Medication at School

Responsibility of the Parent or Guardian

- 1. Parents/guardians shall be encouraged to cooperate with the physician to develop a schedule so the necessity for taking medications at school will be minimized or eliminated.
- 2. Parents/guardians will assume full responsibility for the supply and transportation of all medications.
- 3. Parents/guardians may administer medication to their child on a scheduled basis arranged with the school. Students are not permitted to carry prescribed or over-the-counter medication on school campus.
- 4. Parents/guardians may pick up unused medications from the school office during and at the close of the school year. Medication remaining after the last day will be discarded.
- 5. Each medication is to be in a separate pharmacy container prescribed for the student by a California licensed health care provider.
- 6. Each over-the-counter medication is to be in its original sealed container and prescribed for the student by a California licensed health care provider.

The parent or guardian must complete this page before any medication (prescription or over-the-counter) can be given, or taken, at school. This form must be renewed at the beginning of each school year or with any change in medication.

Parent Request for School Assistance with Medication

I understand that school district regulations require student medication to be maintained in a secure place, under the direction of an adult employee of the school district, and not carried on the person of a student (with the exception of inhalers and epinephrine auto-injectors accompanied by appropriate physician instructions).

Type 2 Diabetes Information

Pursuant to California *Education Code* Section 49452.7, this type 2 diabetes information is for local educational agencies to provide to parents and guardians of incoming seventh grade students beginning July 1, 2010.

The California Department of Education developed this type 2 diabetes information in collaboration with the California Department of Public Health, American Diabetes Association, California School Nurses Organization, and Children's Hospital of Orange County. Also see available translations of this information.

Description

Type 2 diabetes is the most common form of diabetes in adults.

Until a few years ago, type 2 diabetes was rare in children, but it is becoming more common, especially for overweight teens.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), one in three American children born after 2000 will develop type 2 diabetes in his or her lifetime.

Type 2 diabetes affects the way the body is able to use sugar (glucose) for energy.

The body turns the carbohydrates in food into glucose, the basic fuel for the body's cells.

The pancreas makes insulin, a hormone that moves glucose from the blood to the cells.

In type 2 diabetes, the body's cells resist the effects of insulin, and blood glucose levels rise.

Over time, glucose reaches dangerously high levels in the blood, which is called hyperglycemia.

Hyperglycemia can lead to health problems like heart disease, blindness, and kidney failure.

Risk Factors Associated with Type 2 Diabetes

It is recommended that students displaying or possibly experiencing the risk factors and warning signs associated with type 2 diabetes be screened (tested) for the disease.

Risk Factors

Researchers do not completely understand why some people develop type 2 diabetes and others do not; however, the following risk factors are associated with an increased risk of type 2 diabetes in children:

Being overweight. The single greatest risk factor for type 2 diabetes in children is excess weight. In the U.S., almost one out of every five children is overweight. The chances are more than double that an overweight child will develop diabetes.

Family history of diabetes. Many affected children and youth have at least one parent with diabetes or have a significant family history of the disease.

Inactivity. Being inactive further reduces the body's ability to respond to insulin.

Specific racial/ethnic groups. Native Americans, African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, or Asian/Pacific Islanders are more prone than other ethnic groups to develop type 2 diabetes.

Puberty. Young people in puberty are more likely to develop type 2 diabetes than younger children, probably because of normal rises in hormone levels that can cause insulin resistance during this stage of rapid growth and physical development.

Warning Signs and Symptoms Associated with Type 2 Diabetes

Warning signs and symptoms of type 2 diabetes in children develop slowly, and initially there may be no symptoms. However, not everyone with insulin resistance or type 2 diabetes develops these warning signs, and not everyone who has these symptoms necessarily has type 2 diabetes.

Increased hunger, even after eating Unexplained weight loss Increased thirst, dry mouth, and frequent urination Feeling very tired Blurred vision
Slow healing of sores or cuts
Dark velvety or ridged patches of skin, especially on the back of the neck or under the arms
Irregular periods, no periods, and/or excess facial and body hair growth in girls
High blood pressure or abnormal blood fats levels

Type 2 Diabetes Prevention Methods and Treatments

Healthy lifestyle choices can help prevent and treat type 2 diabetes. Even with a family history of diabetes, eating healthy foods in the correct amounts and exercising regularly can help children achieve or maintain a normal weight and normal blood glucose levels.

Eat healthy foods. Make wise food choices. Eat foods low in fat and calories.

Get more physical activity. Increase physical activity to at least 60 minutes every day.

Take medication. If diet and exercise are not enough to control the disease, it may be necessary to treat type 2 diabetes with medication.

The first step in treating type 2 diabetes is to visit a doctor. A doctor can determine if a child is overweight based on the child's age, weight, and height. A doctor can also request tests of a child's blood glucose to see if the child has diabetes or pre-diabetes (a condition which may lead to type 2 diabetes).

Types of Diabetes Screening Tests That Are Available

Glycated hemoglobin (A1C) test. A blood test measures the average blood sugar level over two to three months. An A1C level of 6.5 percent or higher on two separate tests indicates diabetes.

Random (non-fasting) blood sugar test. A blood sample is taken at a random time. A random blood sugar level of 200 milligrams per deciliter (mg/dL) or higher suggests diabetes. This test must be confirmed with a fasting blood glucose test.

Fasting blood sugar test. A blood sample is taken after an overnight fast. A fasting blood sugar level less than 100 mg/dL is normal. A level of 100 to 125 mg/dL is considered pre-diabetes. A level of 126 mg/dL or higher on two separate tests indicates diabetes.

Oral glucose tolerance test. A test measuring the fasting blood sugar level after an overnight fast with periodic testing for the next several hours after drinking a sugary liquid. A reading of more than 200 mg/dL after two hours indicates diabetes.




