ID Card & Class Schedule Pick-up

ID card pick-up will be located in the CN Small Gym (entrance on west side) on **Thursday, August 5, 2021.** ID card pick-up is no longer on a separate day from Walk-Through Registration.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Library Obligations and the Annual Online Information Update must be completed in order to pick up ID card and class schedule at WTR. If you have textbooks and/or computers from last school year, please go to the back windows of the library prior to ID card pick-up in the Small Gym.
- If a student did not take their ID Card Picture and/or does not have an ID Card, a yellow voucher will be given to them at the entrance of WTR and they will take their ID Card Picture in the Small Gym. Students will receive their ID Card the first week of school.

User's Guide to Walk-Through Registration

Walk-Through Registration times are found on the CNEC School Website. We ask that you adhere to your set time so that we may serve all of our families as efficiently as possible. The last time slot of the day will be available for anyone who cannot make it to WTR during their specified time. All students must be present and in dress code.

The Student Store will be open throughout Registration in the Large Gym. You are welcome to shop anytime!

FOR STUDENTS <u>NEW</u> **TO CNEC** - New students and students who did not take an ID picture the prior year, need to report to the Clovis North Small Gym off of Chestnut in order to take their ID Card Picture. ID cards will be available the first week of school. **IMPORTANT**: Yellow voucher required for ID Card Pictures.

FOR ALL STUDENTS

Step 1 - Enter Clovis North Small Gym according to assigned registration time.

Step 2 - Have your Registration Documents Completed

- A) **Mandatory Registration Forms** In order for a student to complete their registration, the Annual Information Update must be completed online prior to Walk-Through Registration by a parent or guardian.
 - Parents will log in with their Parent Connect Pin and Password at http://www.cusd.com/its/parent-connect/.
- Click on the **Annual Information Update** link from the menu in the upper right corner
- Complete Step 1: Update/Enter Contact Information
- Complete Step 2: Update/Enter Student Information (All mandatory forms are located here including: No Cost Meal Application Form, Technology Resources Use/Student User Agreement, Voluntary Random Drug Program (High School Students Only).
- Confirm Information (program will indicate "changes pending" when complete)

Step 3 - Purchasing items - (optional) - Small Gym

If you are purchasing items, please use the <u>RevTrak Online Web Store</u> prior to WTR on Thursday, August 5th. Additional information on the items for purchase may be found in this booklet and attached flyers. If you need access to a computer to complete this, we will have computers available on the day of WTR for your convenience.

Step 4 - Pick-up class schedule - Large Gym - No Elective Changes and No Teacher Changes will be made during Registration. Only incomplete schedules will be corrected prior to August 16, 2021. A form will be available at the Registration counseling table to make schedule change requests. Counselors will contact the student to schedule an appointment.

Step 5 - Pick-up Student Parking Permit (optional) - Large Gym - Bring RevTrak receipt, a completed Parking Permit application (available on the <u>Clovis North Website</u>), student driver's license, and valid student ID with you to Walk-Through Registration. Once the Student Parking Permit has been paid for through the <u>RevTrak Online Web Store</u>, it can be retrieved from the Parking Permit table.

Items Available for Purchase at Registration

The following information will help you understand the different items available to purchase using the <u>RevTrak Online Web Store</u>. We are no longer using an order form. Please complete prior to registration.

PE Clothes:

Granite Ridge Intermediate and Clovis North High School students enrolled in physical education are required to wear appropriate physical education attire. Such attire may be purchased at the RevTrak Online Web Store and, once school begins, in the Athletic Office. All clothing must be in solid colors – no prints, floral, stripes, or logos, other than school related, are permitted. If students choose not to purchase a PE uniform, see below.

SHIRTS and SHORTS:

- <u>Granite Ridge:</u> Shirts must be plain gray. Shorts must be black with elastic waistband only. Plain black leggings are allowed.

- <u>Clovis North:</u> Shirts must be plain Columbia Blue. Shorts must be black with elastic waistband only. Plain black leggings are allowed.

SWEATPANTS:

- Only black sweatpants with elastic around the bottom of the leg are permitted during the winter months.

LOCKS:

- Students are required to have a combination lock for their P.E. locker.
- The advantage of these locks is that the P.E staff has a key to open them if students are unable to remember their combination. Otherwise, the lock may need to be cut off if access to the locker is needed.

Students have the option to purchase Clovis North Educational Center P.E. shirts, shorts, and locks. For your convenience, individual items or a spirit package will be available for purchase through the RevTrak Online Web Store. Beginning Monday, August 16, 2021, P.E. shirts, shorts, and locks can be purchased in the Athletics Office. **PE clothes will be distributed through PE classes once school begins.**

Student On-Campus Parking Permit:

All Clovis North High School students driving to school must have a Student Parking Permit to park on campus. If purchasing a permit at the RevTrak Online Web Store, please bring a completed application (available on the Clovis North Website), student driver's license and valid student ID with you on August 5, 2022. The cost is \$10 per vehicle permit, and is only valid for the current school year (2021-22). After Walk-Through Registration, permits may also be purchased in the Finance Office (located in the Main Office) during the regular school year. Checks for the Student Parking Permit must be made payable to Clovis Unified School District.

PSAT Test (Practice SAT Test):

The Clovis North Educational Center counseling staff recommends that your son/daughter take the PSAT/NMSQT practice tests. These tests provide an excellent opportunity to participate in National testing programs and can be an effective diagnostic tool. There are no passing scores for these tests. On average, students who take the PSAT/NMSQT score higher on the SAT than those who don't and students who take the PSAT/NMSQT twice score even higher. The PSAT/NMSQT tests provide opportunities for juniors to enter scholarship competitions and receive recognition as a National Merit Scholar.

Since there are a limited number of tests, we recommend you sign-up early at the <u>RevTrak Online Web Store</u>. Last day to sign up for the exams is Friday, August 27, 2021 by 4pm. * NO MAKE UPS OR REFUNDS *

SART - The School Assessment Review Team (SART) is a group of parents representing the diversity of our campus and school personnel. This group meets quarterly to discuss and evaluate programs at Clovis North Educational Center and make recommendations to the Principal. This is an opportunity to learn about and provide input on the programs at Clovis North Educational Center.

CNEC ID CARD POLICY - Clovis North Educational Center students must carry their student identification at all times. Students will receive one ID card free of charge at Walk-Through Registration. Replacement cards will cost \$10.00 and will be issued from the Activities Office.

Student ID cards are used for:

- Checking out materials/textbooks from the Library
- Purchasing lunches
- Admission into school athletic events
- Admission into school dances
- Receiving an Off Campus Lunch Pass (Seniors Only)
- To ride any CUSD bus

XELLO - Xello is an interactive, personalized tool for career exploration and planning. Features of Xello include career, learning style and personality assessments, college and career search tools, financial aid information, and scholarship search tools. For information on how to create an account, please see the enclosed flyer in the online registration packet. More information about the Xello program is available through the Counseling Center, or the CNEC website.

CSF and CJSF - The California Scholarship Federation (CSF) for High School students and the California Junior Scholarship Federation (CJSF) for Middle School Students exists to promote and recognize high standards of scholarship service, and citizenship on the part of students in California Schools and is considered to be a state honor society. Membership is based on scholarship and citizenship only. To secure eligibility for membership, a student must earn sufficient points from pre-approved course lists. The majority of the required membership points must come from University of California accepted course work.

Upon graduation from high school, those seniors who have been a member of CSF for four semesters or more in their sophomore, junior, and senior year (one semester is required to be in their senior year) will be declared CSF Life Members. Life Members earn a gold Seal on their diploma, which is recognized by most colleges and universities throughout the nation. Students will be honored at a formal banquet prior to graduation and will also be recognized at their graduation ceremony by wearing a gold cord commemorating their CSF Life Membership. Each year, colleges and universities throughout the United States award scholarships to CSF Life Members.

Applications will be available from the CSF Advisor, Lisa Bennett, or in the CNEC Main Office. Membership dues are paid per semester for all grades at the beginning of each eligible semester. Report cards and dues must be presented to the CSF advisor to confirm grades and classes approved by the California Scholarship Federation, within the first four (4) weeks of each new semester. No applications will be accepted past the four-week deadline.

PARENT CONNECT

Parent Connect is the web based program that is used in the Clovis Unified School District and at Clovis North Educational Center. Parent Connect gives access to a student's academic progress and attendance throughout the school year. We encourage all parents to utilize the Parent Connect system.

- How do I get connected? In order to access Parent Connect, a Personal Identification Number (PIN) is needed. The PIN is issued through the school. The PIN and a password grants access into Parent Connect. The program can be accessed itself through the Clovis

North home page. Easier access can be gained for future visits by bookmarking the web address on your computer.

- **Do I need a different PIN and password for each student I have at CNEC?** No. Once in the program, a different student can be selected.
- Is my PIN from last year still valid? Yes.
- What if I forget my PIN and Password? Go to the Parent Connect Log On page then click on the link "Need Your Login Information?" Type in the email address on file with Clovis Unified and click Submit. If the email address entered matches what is on file, an email with the login information will be sent.
- **How do I check grades?** As a parent, you have access to your student's most current grade in each of his/her classes. Once an assignment is completed and scored by a teacher, it is entered in the Assignments section of Parent Connect.
- Can I check my student's attendance records? Yes. Parent Connect is linked to the Clovis North/Granite Ridge attendance system.

Surviving the First Week of School

The very first week of school is not typical compared to most other weeks of the year. Special situations associated with the beginning of school will often create difficulties for students, especially for students new to the campus. We believe that if you follow the suggestions below, the first week of school will go smoothly for the student.

LUNCH - All student lunches are free to the student body for the 2021-2022 school year.

COUNSELORS - Counselors will be available on or about August 6th and through the first weeks of school. You may call 327-5056 for an appointment.

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS - Parents/guardians and students need to drive and park with extreme care, especially the first two weeks of school. Traffic enforcement will be in place on the streets around school and citations will be issued when appropriate. The most common violations include speeding, double parking to pick-up or drop-off students, jaywalking and illegal turns.
